African American Studies is the study of the culture and history of people of African decent. This historical journey begins before the arrival of the first blacks to North America. We will study some of the culture, geographical features and history of the continent of Africa. We will examine how blacks who had been traded to the new world for good helped to transform this country socially, politically and economically. We will study the struggle for freedom, equality and identity; as well as consider other topics such as violence, political and institutional racism, the Great Migration, Harlem Renaissance and the current state of Black America.

Students will examine a variety of primary sources. They will read novels and short stories to help students understand the time period and issues discussed. Films, art and music will be used to supplement the lectures and discussions. Students will write reaction papers, do power point presentations, oral histories and write a research paper.
